

<u>CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) Awareness Training</u> CPR saves lives. For every minute that passes without receiving CPR or having a defibrillator used after cardiac arrest, chances of survival decrease by 10%. Starting CPR as soon as possible gives the person the best chance of surviving a cardiac arrest. CPR Awareness Training is offered to all members of the congregation and will take place in the church hall on **Thursday**, **18 September** from 7pm until 9pm. This will be a "drop in" session, taking approx. 15 minutes each session.
